

Pottstown Play Streets

Evaluation Report Fall 2024



Overview

Play Streets is a summer outdoor program which temporarily closes a neighborhood block to traffic and provides play equipment to **create safe**, **fun**, **and healthy spaces for children**, **families and neighborhoods** to connect and play right outside their doors. Pottstown Play Streets aims to increase physical activity opportunities and promote community cohesion for children and families.



The Pottstown Parks and Recreation Department **provides equipment for activities** including connect four, jump rope, sidewalk chalk, cornhole, life-size jenga, bean bag toss, hula hoops, footballs, kickballs, basketballs, and soccer balls. Community organizations provide outreach and offer individual programs and activities.





Evaluation Approach


To continue to learn about how to improve Play Streets in the future, the Coalition partners with evaluators from the University of Delaware. The evaluation approach is designed to capture both **stories of impact and also opportunities to learn and improve**. For example, at each event, volunteers count participants and record their thoughts about successes and challenges.

Additional information was gathered from program stakeholders during informal discussions and a debrief meeting in September 2024. This evaluation report summarizes what was learned through those processes.

Locations


Seven Play Streets events were planned across Pottstown. Locations and Census tract information is provided in the map below.


Reach

During the summer of 2024, Pottstown Play Streets drew over 673 neighbors across seven events. About half of the attendees were children and teens.

Impact on Community Organizations

Play Streets promotes **safe and fun recreational activities** in Pottstown, reducing access gaps to social resources like **food, housing, benefit navigation, and healthcare**. These events enhance community and youth engagement, foster social cohesion, and improve interactions with community agencies, ultimately aiming to boost overall community health and wellness.

Pottstown Play Streets **fosters community connections** beyond benefiting children and families. Managed by the Pottstown Parks and Recreation Department, it collaborates with the Pottstown Play Streets Coalition, which includes local businesses, organizations, and funders, to plan, implement, and evaluate the program each year.

What's New in 2024?

- Beautiful weather for all events supported full program implementation.
- Improved paperwork and event set-up processes contributed to better communication and more efficient events.
- Increased opportunities for partner participation and evaluation, which promotes inclusivity and ease of experience for new and existing partners.
- New connections with organizations serving individuals with disabilities to improve access and inclusion across events.
- More than a dozen community partners have become multiyear partners with Play Streets, plus a dozen new partners joined this year.

Programs & Activities

Pottstown Play Streets Coalition members include non-profits, healthcare providers, youth-serving organizations, social services, schools, and religious organizations coordinated to provide outreach, programs, and activities at one or more Play Streets events. While every coalition member sprovided activities for community members, some activity highlights in 2024 included:

- Pottstown Parks and Recreation supplied the free play equipment for each event as well as free t-shirts and water.
- **Pottstown Children's Discovery Center** provided mystery STEM boxes and books for children.
- Mother Goose Read to Me provided free books for children.
- Pottstown Community Arts provided art activities, including bubble wands and sidewalk chalk.
- Greater Pottstown Tennis & Learning offered an introduction to tennis with fun games.
- Tower Health provided educational materials for children focused on health.
- YWCA supplied additional free play equipment, including double dutch, giant jenga, human ring toss, a family obstacle course, and four square.
- Pottstown Cluster of Religious Communities provided information on food insecurity and engaged community members in an interactive healthy food game.
- Family Services of Montgomery County supplied outdoor games and activities for families as well as outreach for their programs.



- Habitat for Humanity of
 Montgomery and Delaware Counties
 had conversations with community
 members about neighborhood needs
 and housing repairs, with the goal of
 helping homeowners in Pottstown get
 their home repairs done.
- Trellis for Tomorrow offered games, like wiffle ball, and did a produce giveaway.



Future Directions

What Went Well

Coalition members celebrated **increased efficiency** as a result of intentional program improvements. Partners noted that reduced paperwork and more accessible, digital processes during this year's program contributed to **smooth event set-up** and **reduced administrative burden**.

In 2023, coalition members recognized the need to increase youth engagement at events. Both event attendance and partner feedback confirmed **increased youth participation** in 2024.



Overall, Play Streets also reached a larger audience in 2024, reflecting **increased community awareness** of the event and program expansion in 2024. Play Streets 2024 included a new program site on Spruce Street, as well as a dozen new coalition members. In addition to new members, Play Streets has had **excellent partner retention**, with over a dozen coalition members sustained since 2022. Multiyear partnerships and increased event attendance indicate overall satisfaction with the program and prospect for future growth.

Coalition members consistently spoke highly of how Play Streets created a sense of community and provided an **opportunity to meet and connect** with organizations similar to their own. The **colorful and festive ambience** of events also made a lasting impression on coalition members and event attendees.

Opportunities for Growth

Coalition members identified several opportunities to expand the reach of Play Streets in the future. In addition to current social media efforts t promote the events, coalition members highlighted the need to **optimize and expand the existing social marketing and communication strategies** for the events, including partners sharing the existing marketing materials across their own platforms. Partners also expressed the importanct of maintaining the coalition network throughout the year, in order to **increase community awareness and partnerships.** Finally, coalition members noted the opportunities to expand the Play Streets network at other related community events, like the Harvest Festival and National Night Out.


